There are two main styles of drafting tables. Tilt-top tables allow you to adjust the workspace to a comfortable angle, while flat tabletops are great for large projects or group work.



Melamine and fiberesin tabletops are inexpensive and lightweight, while solid wood, safety glass and high-pressure laminate represent the most durable choices for classrooms.



Self-leveling glides ensure perfect stability for tables on all types of floors. Locking casters lend flexibility to art classrooms and creative studios.



Combining tables with storage and other extra options creates a more cohesive art studio.

Types of Drafting & Art Tables



Classroom Art Tables

Sturdy, flat and designed to withstand every kind of art project, classroom art tables are ideal for multiple students to work at once. Most often featuring wide tops, every student can be given plenty of space to sketch, paint, sculpt or do any other art activities.

Glass Art Tables

Made with tempered glass for safety and durability, glass art tables are contemporary options for individual architects and students. Wood Drafting Tables

Tilting Drafting Tables

Tables with a tilt-top allow students to adjust the angle of the surface to suit their own styles. These architectural drafting tables often have a split-top, where only a part of the table is adjustable. The second part of the art table remains flat, making it a good place for note taking or laptop work. Many tables adjust to multiple angles, so most anyone can find a comfortable position.


